BECOME A BENICIA TREE-KEEPER

Today, there is an urgent need to plant more trees in Benicia. Asphalt, urban development and lack of tree care are among the factors diminishing our community forest, and the consequences are visibly evident in many parts of the city.

Did you know?

- A mature tree can absorb carbon dioxide at a rate of 48 pounds per year, releasing enough oxygen back into the atmosphere to support two human beings.
- One mature tree shading your urban house (thus saving energy) can equal an offset of as much as 15 trees in a forest.

 Each tree offsets about 48 pounds of carbon a year. One urban tree, equivalent to 15 forest trees, absorbs 48 pounds of carbon a year. One urban forest tree can therefore help offset 720 pounds of CO2 annually.
- The Benicia Tree-Planting Initiative has the potential to offset 720,000 pounds of carbon (1,000 trees by 2012).


