

## BENICIA TREE FOUNDATION ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2023

## **About Us**

The Benicia Tree Foundation (BTF) is an all-volunteer non-profit organization with the mission to strengthen community by promoting and supporting tree planting, maintenance, and education. We were established in 2009, the same year the City of Benicia unanimously adopted its first comprehensive tree program. Since that time **BTF** has planted over 1,000 trees in Benicia.

## Accomplishments for 2023

BTF sponsored five events that **planted 18 trees** and numerous acorns, and sponsored 15 Tree Care Days that **maintained 450 trees**. Cumulatively, we **attracted 134 volunteers**, with one-third being under 18 years of age. These volunteers **generated 562 hours of labor** for tree planting and maintenance, and for educating residents about our urban forest.

Cooperative projects between the City of Benicia and BTF included a <u>2023 Arbor Day event</u> that planted 10 trees at Overlook Park and planting acorns at Lake Herman Open Space. BTF commented on the update to the <u>Parks Trails & Open Space Master Plan</u>, requesting that the plan support planting native trees on in the 1,800 acres of city-owned open space, and planting more trees as part of the proposed upgrades to the City's 28 parks.

BTF is funded entirely by donations and in 2023, received over **\$2,800** in donations from nine different individuals and organizations.

## Goals for 2024

- · Recruiting new Board members.
- Establish new cooperative relationships with other organizations to support Benicia's urban forest.
- Install interpretive sign at Joe Henderson Elementary School project site.
- Attract more volunteers to our tree care days on second Saturdays and third Thursdays
  of the month where we meet at one of our project sites to perform routine tree
  maintenance tasks.
- Support the City's Tree Program by co-sponsoring an annual Arbor Day tree planting, participating on the Tree Subcommittee of the Parks Recreation & Cemetery Commission, and supporting the update of the Park Trails & Open Space Master Plan and development of a Citywide Landscaping and Lighting Assessment District.
